RYAN DODD SETS PENDING COLLEGIATE WORLD JUMP RECORD

ORLANDO, FL (September 28, 2004) —Team Nautique skier Ryan Dodd of Olds, Canada set a pending jump record during the NCWSA Regional Championships held September 25^{th} – 26^{th} at Aquaplex Ski Lake in Austin, Texas.

Dodd is a star on the University of Louisiana-Monroe ski team. A sophomore, Dodd has now raised the bar for up and coming collegiate athletes. Moments before Dodd's 201-foot jump, Tom Asher set a pending Collegiate World Jump Record at 194 feet. Two minutes after Dodd's 201-foot jump he did it again, popping 201 feet off the five-foot ramp at a boat speed of 31 MPH. Dodd and his ULM teammates took second place and will advance in Division I to Collegiate Nationals.

When asked, how he accomplished such a distance, Dodd stated, "It has been great to train this year at ULM because we have a new Correct Craft and a new Bemman jump ramp. I knew I could break this record but I sure didn't plan to take a cut like that, at least now I know it's possible!"
