LeFORESTIER AND LUCINE BREAK MASTERS COURSE RECORDS

PINE MOUNTAIN, GA. (May 27, 2006)—During the elimination rounds of 47th Correct Craft Masters Waterski and Wakeboard Tournament at Callaway Gardens in Pine Mountain, Georgia, the men's trick course record was broken by Nicolas LeForestier who tricked 11,860 points breaking his own course record of 11,710 set at the 44th Masters in 2003. The rest of the field chasing LeForestier includes Jimmy Siemers, Aliaksei Zharnasek and Jaret Llewellyn who advance to the finals on Sunday.

The elimination round of men's slalom featured a four-way tie for first place at 3@39-off including world record holder Chris Parrish, Jamie Beauschesne, William Asher and Drew Ross.

In the men's jump competition, Scot Ellis set the tone of the event with a jump of 224 feet. Jaret Llewellyn answered with a jump of 228 feet, claiming first place. Jason Seels edged out Freddy Krueger by just a tenth of a meter at 227 feet. Ellis' jump put him in the fourth spot in the finals.

In women's competition, Clementine Lucine also set a new course record for women's tricks at 8490 points, shattering the old record of 7880 points set in 1996. Other athletes advancing to the trick finals include Regina Jaquess, Michale Briant and Mandy Nightingale.

In the elimination round of women's slalom, Sarah Green is seeded first, rounding 3@38-off (11.25m). Natalie Hamrick, Michelle Simpson and Clementine Lucine tied for second at 2.5@38-off (11.25m).

In the elimination round of women's jump, Angeliki Andriopoulou is seeded first, followed by June Flagbord, and Clementine Lucine and Marie Vypranietsova tied for third.

In the women's wakeboard elimination rounds, Amber Wing and Tara Hamilton outscored Maeghan Major and Lauren Loe in heat #1 to move on to the finals. Emily Copeland and Laura Lohrmann moved on from heat #2 and Dallas Friday and Louise Moore from heat #3 will advance to competition Sunday.

The men's wakeboarding semi-finals featured head-to-head competition starting with Daniel Watkins against Dan Nott; Nott won with a score of 52.23 moving him into the finals. Andrew Adkison completed two passes edging out Jeff Weatherall in heat #2. In heat #3, Rusty Malinoski, with a score of 70.00, moved past Chad Sharpe for a chance at the title in the finals. Danny Harf defeated Tino Santori for a spot in the finals.

The Masters' final rounds begin at 11 a.m. Sunday with head to head competition in all events. Competition at this year's Masters includes Men's and Women's slalom, tricks and jumping, and Men's and Women's wakeboarding. All events are sanctioned by USA Waterski and USA Wakeboard.
